

Vaccination at the Pharmacy

Your workplace has chosen to offer you a flu vaccination at any Apovac pharmacy of your choice*.

The Process

It's quick and easy. Simply visit any Apovac pharmacy during the designated period, present your yellow health card, and provide the necessary details.

You will then be vaccinated by one of our certified vaccinators. After the vaccination, it is recommended that you stay for 15 minutes for observation. After this brief period, you can continue with your day as usual.

Why Get Vaccinated Against Influenza?

Influenza is a common and highly contagious viral illness that affects many people every autumn and winter. Each year, 5-15% of the population contracts the flu, and during an epidemic, up to 20% of the population may become ill.

For most people, influenza causes symptoms such as fever, muscle aches, headaches, fatigue, coughing, and a sore throat.

Getting vaccinated is one of the most reliable ways to reduce the risk of catching the flu.

The flu vaccine has very few side effects. The most common reactions are temporary swelling and soreness at the injection site, mild fever, or a headache.

These side effects usually resolve within 1-2 days.
