

Vaccination at the Pharmacy

Your workplace has chosen to offer you a flu vaccination at any Apoerhverv pharmacy of your choice.

The process

It's quick and easy. Some pharmacies offer drop-in vaccination, while others require you to book an appointment in advance.

At www.apoerhverv.dk, you can find the pharmacies where vaccination is available and see whether you need to book an appointment or can simply drop in.

At the pharmacy, you will be vaccinated by a certified vaccinator. After the vaccination, it is recommended that you remain at the pharmacy for 15 minutes for observation. You can then continue your day as usual.



Why Get Vaccinated Against Influenza

Influenza is a common and highly contagious viral illness that affects many people every autumn and winter. Each year, 5-15% of the population contracts the flu, and during an epidemic, up to 20% of the population may become ill.

For most people, flu causes symptoms such as fever, muscle aches, headaches, fatigue, coughing, and a sore throat.

Getting vaccinated is one of the most reliable ways to reduce the risk of catching the flu. The flu vaccine has very few side effects. The most common reactions are temporary swelling and soreness at the injection site, mild fever, or a headache.

These side effects usually resolve within 1-2 days.
